

Honeycroft remained open to support vulnerable and critical worker families during the national lockdown.

Between March and June only 30% of nursery settings remained open in Brighton and Hove, however the Honeycroft team and trustees remained committed to staying open during the pandemic to fulfil our charitable objectives and provide care and support to local critical workers and vulnerable families.

Of the children attending Honeycroft during lockdown; 58% were from critical worker families,
